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Presenter Bio: Lee Draper, Ph.D.

Dr. Draper's broad understanding of nonprofit organizations and grantmakers comes from over 30 years of experience performing the full range of roles in philanthropy: as program officer at the Ahmanson and W.M. Keck foundations, director of grantmaking programs at the California Community Foundation, board member, nonprofit executive, and active member of local and national associations.

She heads Draper Consulting Group (DCG), a firm that has provided high quality consulting services to over 120 grantmakers and non-profit agencies since 1990. It specializes in strategic planning, board governance, and private sector fund development (including foundation/corporate grantsmanship, major donors, and capital campaigns).
